The Sisters are beginning to prepare for the International Superiors Assembly, scheduled to take place at Mount Grace in the fall of 2008, and the added space created by the expansion is a necessity. Those planning to come for the Sacred Heart Novena in 2008, during which we will celebrate the 80th anniversary of our convent and chapel, will be glad to have the off-street parking.

When we sent out our letter in February announcing our building project and asking for help, we were literally overwhelmed by the response we received. From those who gave their “widow’s mite” to those who were able to give more, we were touched by the generosity of all. So far we have raised nearly one-fourth of the money we need. Along with the money came many notes telling us how our convent in north St. Louis has impacted lives. Some had parents or grandparents who helped build or furnish the chapel or garden. Some have gotten engaged while making a visit to the Blessed Sacrament here. We received a letter from a woman who had grown up on East Warne Avenue and was 14 years old when Mount Grace was built in 1928. She came every day to the chapel to pray that she would marry the right man. She and her husband had 70 happy years together, raised four children, and now she has 21 great-grandchildren. Our life of prayer and sacrifice is a hidden one, and we do not often see tangible results. In a world that emphasizes productivity and measurable success, we spend our lives in quiet prayer for all in need. We are content to wait for the next life to receive our reward, but the mail that flooded in was an edifying experience for us. It reinforced the idea that we are all connected and interdependent, relying on each other to help make the world a better place. Our generous benefactors have a special place in our prayers, and we know we can rely on your continued support.




Raising funds, having fun



Friends and benefactors immediately thought of us, making sure we had everything we needed. Our workman battled snow and ice to set up a generator so that the Sisters would be able to have hot water. In the quiet darkness that resulted from the lack of electricity, we prayed for those who were suffering from the storm, those who were out on dangerous roads, and those who had no one to care for their needs. While on one hand the ice caused great devastation, on the other hand it was a source of great beauty. Our garden was transformed into a crystal palace, a breath-taking sight. The sun caused everything to shimmer and we marveled at how the bleak winter scene had been altered into something more magnificent than Solomon in all his glory. When the ice melted and the electricity was restored, we were grateful to be able to return to our regular schedule.
