




Visitors

In thanking our friends, we cannot forget to gratefully acknowledge the diligent work and care provided by our employees.







On May 21 our two novices made their first profession of



vows: Sister Maria Epifania and Sister Mary Sophia. The night before their profession, Sister Maria Epifania and Sister Mary Sophia were invested with our rose-colored habit as a sign of our consecration to the Holy Spirit as his servants. They also received their religious names, symbolizing the unique call of the Lord for each Sister. The ceremony the next morning was very beautiful and solemn.

Monsignor Edward Rice, Vicar of Religious, was the main celebrant, accompanied by nine concelebrating priests and two deacons. During the ceremony, the celebrating Sisters received the veil, a symbol of their bridal relationship to Christ, and a copy of our Constitutions which lays



before the newly professed the new way of life they have vowed to lived. Finally they received their profession cross, which contains the “image of the grace-dispensing love of the Holy Spirit and of the crucified love of our Savior” (St. Arnold). It was a day of joy and deep gratitude as each Sister remembered her own first profession of vows and God’s fidelity to her. Sister Maria Epifania is from Puerto Rico. She moved to North Carolina after obtaining her doctorate in dentistry and there discerned her vocation. She found our community through the Internet and was instantly attracted to our founder, St. Arnold Janssen. Sister Mary Sophia came to us from Texas. While in college, she discerned her vocation with our community in Corpus Christi. A couple days in Corpus Christi proved too short for her as she had quickly fallen in love with our life and spirituality. May the Lord grant perseverance to our newly professed!
